Mallard	A few seen flying overhead
Common Eider	Many seen on the ocean
White-winged Scoter	A flock at Hampton Beach
Black Scoter	A flock in Rye
Ruffed Grouse	Heard briefly at Clough State Park - not heard by all
Wild Turkey	Two seen roadside
Red-throated Loon	One seen in Rye
Common Loon	Several seen on the ocean
Red-necked Grebe	Two seen in breeding plumage
Horned Grebe	One seen in breeding plumage
Double-crested Cormorant	Many seen on the ocean
Great Blue Heron	Several seen flying
Great Egret	Two seen at Eel Pond in Rye
Turkey Vulture	Several seen flying
Broad-winged Hawk	One seen near Clough State Park
Northern Goshawk	One heard making loud alarm call
Red-tailed Hawk	One seen
Clapper Rail	One heard briefly
Virginia Rail	Two seen at Chapman's Landing in Stratham
Killdeer	One seen on coast
Solitary Sandpiper	One seen in Weare
Willet	Several seen and heard in Hampton
Spotted Sandpiper	Several seen, two seen and heard in Weare
Purple Sandpiper	Over 10 seen on the coast
Bonaparte's Gull	Several seen on the coast
Ring-billed Gull	Several seen on the coast
Herring Gull	Several seen on the coast
Great Black-backed Gull	Several seen on the coast
Common Tern	Several seen and heard on the coast
Rock Pigeon	Several seen daily in urban sites
Mourning Dove	Many heard and seen
Great Horned Owl	One heard making alarm call near nest
Common Nighthawk	Heard on several nights in Concord
Chimney Swift	Seen and heard every day in Concord
Ruby-throated Hummingbird	A couple seen - not sure their squeak counts as a call or song
Belted Kingfisher	One seen and heard rattling
Yellow-bellied Sapsucker	A few heard rat-a-tat-tatting in their morse code-like drumming
Downy Woodpecker	A few heard calling and drumming
Hairy Woodpecker	A few heard calling and drumming
Northern Flicker	Seen and heard calling
Pileated Woodpecker	Heard calling
Eastern Wood-Pewee	A few heard
Alder Flycatcher	Several seen and heard, demanding "free-beer"
Least Flycatcher	Che-bek, che-bek! Nothing "least" about this call
Eastern Phoebe	A couple seen and heard

Great Crested Flycatcher	Wheep! Wheep! from the woods
Eastern Kingbird	A distinctive twitter - we heard this a couple of times
Yellow-throated Vireo	One heard briefly at Pawtuckaway State Park
Blue-headed Vireo	Several heard and seen
Warbling Vireo	Heard many of these, also a few seen
Red-eyed Vireo	Heard many, but only saw a few
Blue Jay	Mostly heard making standard calls
American Crow	Easy to identify
Common Raven	A few hoarse croaks heard and several seen flying
Tree Swallow	Twittering overhead
Northern Rough-winged Swallow	Seen and heard buzzing
Bank Swallow	Seen and heard buzzing
Barn Swallow	We heard and saw a couple
Black-capped Chickadee	Seen and heard almost every day
Red-breasted Nuthatch	Several heard making their odd "ank ank" calls
White-breasted Nuthatch	Several seen and heard
Brown Creeper	Several heard singing at Pawtuckaway
Marsh Wren	Two heard at Chapman's Landing in Stratham
Eastern Bluebird	One or two seen in Canterbury
Veery	Heard many of these amazing songsters, both calling and singing
Hermit Thrush	Only a few heard - but a beautiful song
Wood Thrush	A few heard - e-olay!
American Robin	Many heard and seen
Gray Catbird	A couple heard - one seemed like a Brown Thrasher style at first
Brown Thrasher	Heard one
European Starling	A few seen and heard in urban sites
Cedar Waxwing	A few seen
Blue-winged Warbler	Heard and seen well in Weare
Nashville Warbler	Several heard, but not well
Yellow Warbler	Lots of these were seen and heard
Chestnut-sided Warbler	We heard a few of these and saw several
Magnolia Warbler	Only a couple seen - not really heard
Black-throated Blue Warbler	A female seen at Odiorne Point State Park in Rye
Yellow-rumped Warbler	A few heard
Black-throated Green Warbler	A few heard
Blackburnian Warbler	Great looks at several and two different songs heard
Pine Warbler	Several heard at Pawtuckaway
Prairie Warbler	Several heard near the Concord airport
Blackpoll Warbler	Several heard and seen at scattered locations
Black-and-white Warbler	Several heard and seen at scattered locations
American Redstart	Many of these heard, mostly making their "sneeze" calls
Ovenbird	We heard many of these and saw several
Northern Waterthrush	Only heard one of these
Common Yellowthroat	We heard many of these and saw several
Canada Warbler	Heard two but never got a good look
Scarlet Tanager	Several heard, making both their song and call note
Eastern Towhee	Heard near the Concord airport
Chipping Sparrow	Many heard and seen
Field Sparrow	A few heard and seen at the Concord airport
Savannah Sparrow	Several heard and seen at the Canterbury sod farms
Song Sparrow	We heard many of these and saw several
Nelson's Sharp-tailed Sparrow	A few seen and heard well at Chapman's Landing in Stratham

Saltmarsh Sharp-tailed Sparrow	A few heard and seen well at Hampton Marsh
Swamp Sparrow	Several heard in Concord and at Pawtuckaway
Northern Cardinal	Many heard and seen
Rose-breasted Grosbeak	Many heard and seen
Indigo Bunting	A few heard and seen
Bobolink	A few seen at a distance
Red-winged Blackbird	This species is certainly common - we heard and saw many!
Common Grackle	Ditto
Purple Finch	We were able to hear several of New Hampshire's state bird
American Goldfinch	There wer many of these about, making their confusing twittering calls
Evening Grosbeak	Over 10 heard at Partuckaway, and a few seen
House Sparrow	Several heard at urban sites

Porcupine	Three adults and two porcupettes (babies) seen
White-tailed Deer	A few seen
Eastern Red Squirrel	Several seen
Eastern Chipmunk	Several seen - good to be able to recognize their call
Garter Snake	One seen
Spring Peeper	Several heard
Gray Tree Frog	Several heard
American Toad	Trilling, and hopping across the trail
